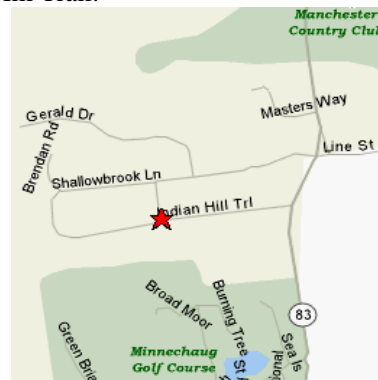

**RACE REPORT: Baltimore Road Runners Club NCR Trail Marathon, Sparks, MD
November 27, 2004**

Following a Thanksgiving trip to visit with friends in NJ, and going to the Rutgers UConn football game, my family and I headed out to Sparks Maryland to take part in the 15th running of the NCR Trail Marathon. According to MarathonGuide.com this was a nice flat, fast course that consisted of a gently rolling country road start followed by a 12 mile slightly uphill out and 11 mile slightly downhill back with a "gently" rolling 2 mile uphill finish.

We decided to stay at the Inner Harbor in Baltimore and head to the race in the AM. Race morning weather was perfect for shorts and a jersey in the low mid 40's. Managed to get a decent nights sleep, and was looking to PR. After a promising 3:29 at Hartford, I was looking to try to break 3:20 at this race. The race was staged at an elementary School and was a very comfortable place to work out pre race jitters. They gave us a nice fleece vest, a pin, and the other usual trinkets.

The things that weighed on my mind were the lasting effects of my broken shoulder, and the nagging left knee which after many months of silence had reappeared a week and a half ago.

The race was small however the overall mood was serious as we lined up. I was warned that the course, although certified was mismarked at the first mile 601 ft short and at the final "point two" which was 601 ft long. However I was nervous as I checked my watch and saw the first downhill mile in at 6:17 and the second mile at 7:11. From there as we entered the trail I went into my planned pace of 7:38's for a time without issue. Heartrate was OK around 163, and I enjoyed the scenery of the beautiful horse country and waterfalls along the flat crushed stone path. All was well until crossing a road around mile 10 and my left knee cracked and started to act up. However it did not seem to get much worse for a while. I saw Peg, Nick and Jack at the turnaround and was feeling tired but still OK. Although I have read a million times, that you can't "bank time", as I hit the half with a time of 1:38:21 I was wondering if it counted that some of it was downhill.

As I turned, I woke up to the fact that I would be running into a steady head wind for the next leg of the race. As things progressed I found myself searching and anticipating the next markers, and concentrating on form. Miles 17 through 19 were a struggle and took a lot to maintain the pace of around 7:45, as I began to slowly withdraw from the time bank. I started to sense more severe trouble as my shoulder flared at 19.5 miles. However any concerns that I had about my shoulder pain were shortly eclipsed by overall mile 20 fatigue issues. The runners were spread pretty thin at this stage so it was difficult to pace and stay consistent, as most others were shuffling.

At this point I began my marathon death groan. As those who have traveled long and or hard distances with me can attest, I was not exactly a sparkling ambassador of our sport to the general public as I tramped by like an escaped Halloween freak. I left the trail just after mile 24 and started doing the math. I knew at that point that a sub 3:20 was not going to happen, as I was now on an ~8:00 min pace with serious hills ahead. However I knew if I held on I stood a good chance of a PR. However the "Gentle Rolling"[sic] hills took their toll and I slowed to nearly a 9:00 min pace on the 26th mile. With a push up the final hill and many other indescribable utterings, I made it to the finish. And was stripped of my race chip and plopped flat out on the grass, wrapped in Mylar. My family was there to identify the body.

After hanging out trading stories and eating homemade soup, my family and I visited the Aquarium at the Inner Harbor and dinned on huge Cheeseburgers at The Hard Rock Cafe.

So, here's the race by the numbers:

Finish Time: **3:23:51** PR by **5** minutes and **44** seconds Beat all but the Top **3** Women

Total Finishers: **298** Overall Place **49th** M 40-44 Place **16th**

Place at 1/2 Marathon **66th** **4** runners passed me in last 1/2 I passed **20** runners in last 1/2

Trip home 8+ hours including Water stops and a visit to Denny's for a Lumberjack Slam Breakfast that made it all seem worthwhile.

My family and I are looking forward to a restful and rejuvenating winter. Here's wishing you the same. *Peace, Art*

COACH'S CORNER: Winter Running
by Barry Stoner

Winter is not the time to stop running. Of course there are many sloppy snowy days when running is not very pleasant; however, there are also a lot of good days when running in the cold and on the snow is fun and not such a big deal. Running through the winter does require some adjustments to keep up with your training and keep it fun. A few tips are: dress properly so as to remain comfortable without overdressing; shorten your runs on the coldest days; avoid the most sloppy conditions if possible; stay hydrated; wear sun glasses to avoid the albedo; keep a regular routine of at least three days running per week; and consider long slow distance instead of the pounding from speed on the hard cold inflexible roads. Winter might also be the perfect time to cross-train.

Some additional tips on shoes & socks for winter running from Active.com:

- Don't run in your old worn out shoes. You need more cushioning in the winter since cold shoes are less flexible.
- Avoid cotton socks - use synthetic socks or "Smartwool" which provide wicking & warmth.
- Make sure the socks are not too thick, and leave your toes some wiggle room.
- Try a "Trail Running Shoe" to add traction
